Paul Ehrlich is Professor of Biology, Bing Professor of Population Studies, and President of the Center for Conservation Biology at Stanford University. His research interests are in the ecology and evolution of natural populations of butterflies, reef fishes, birds and human beings. One of his overriding concerns has been that humanity is treating the Earth as though it has unlimited resources, fearing that "mankind will breed itself into oblivion." His landmark book *The Population Bomb* (1968) and hundreds of his papers address the issue. Prof. Ehrlich is the recipient of many international science and environmental awards, including Sweden's Crafoord Prize that he shared with E.O. Wilson. He is a Fellow of the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, AAAS, and the Royal Society of London, among others.
