

FREEDOM RIDERS The interracial group of college students rode buses into the deep South, risking violence and death, to make visible the illegal segregation in interstate transportation and embarrass the power establishment into enforcing the law. (January 25)

FREEDOM SUMMER The summer of 1964, which brought hundreds of college students into the deep South to join local people in registering voters and creating Freedom Schools and saw the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party challenge the delegation of the segregationist state Democratic Party at the Democratic National Convention. (February 1)

SLAVERY BY ANOTHER NAME Which shows how forced labor continued after the reconstruction era, well into the 20th Century (February 8)

THE LOVING STORY The love of an interracial couple and their determination to live in the place they knew as home led to the Supreme Court case that made interracial marriage legal throughout the nation. (February 15)

THE ABOLITIONISTS Tells the stories of both black and white leaders in the struggle against slavery before the Civil War. (February 22)
